

# White Stuff stops off at Porthmeor for anniversary

There were free treats for all when clothing brand White Stuff parked a vintage ice cream truck above Porthmeor Beach.

St Ives was the first stop in the company's tour of seaside towns to celebrate its 40th anniversary, and as well as enjoying ice creams in a variety of fabulous flavours, visitors to the van also had the chance to win a limited-edition White Stuff birthday T-shirt.

White Stuff, which has a branch in Fore Street, teamed up with St Ives Surf School for the day to offer free surf lessons and gear hire, and also donated £1,000 to The Wave Project, the charity which helps young people improve their mental health and build confidence through surfing.



# The tennis courts with the best views



September marks the fifth anniversary of the new courts which have transformed St Ives Tennis Club. The club has boomed since becoming the first in Cornwall to introduce synthetic red clay courts when it replaced its crumbling tarmac ones.

The results — on and off the court — have been stunning, with membership rocketing from less than 100 to a current high of 250. The arrivals include some excellent young players, attracted by the opportunity to play at their local club on the surface favoured by the Lawn Tennis Association for developing players, and St Ives currently fields four

teams punching above their weight in the Cornwall LTA leagues. The near £100,000 project, a daunting prospect for a small two-court club, was achieved in partnership with Sport England's Community Asset Fund, which provided half the cost.

The courts were ready for play in September 2020, and were officially opened by David Rawlinson, then president of the LTA. The club, which boasts that it has "the best tennis court views anywhere" has not only attracted many new members – along with visitors booking the courts – it also offers the fast–growing sport of pickleball.



# Raise the roof for St Ives Concert Band

St Ives Concert Band is beginning a major refurbishment of its historic bandroom, thanks to funding from Cornwall Council's Community Levelling Up Programme, and a generous contribution from the St Ives

Operatic Society.

The bandroom was built in 1926 by original town band members, and their present-day counterparts will celebrate its 100th anniversary next year. The Raise a New Roof project will replace the roof, install new carbon-efficient heating and new windows and doors, and significantly improve the space's comfort, energy use and accessibility. It will also open the building to a wider range of creative community use.

Funding Officer Laura Tan said: "This project is about more than just replacing a roof. It's about honouring the vision of those who built this space, and creating a vibrant, sustainable hub for music, arts and wellbeing

in St Ives."



The refurbished space will be ideally suited for small ensemble rehearsals, individual music teaching and practice, art and music workshops, and creative events and community gatherings.

Autumn events will include a choir, open taster workshops, and a collaborative drawing-and-music event organised by local artist Alice Mumford – who plays in the band – to bring new creative energy into the space.

"Music and the arts play a vital role in our community's wellbeing," said Laura. "This project is a chance to support mental health, social connection, and creative expression, all under one roof – a new roof."

Reach for the Stars was the theme of this year's hugely popular Hayle Carnival. The all-singing, all-dancing procession featured a cast of characters ranging from stilt walkers to talent show competitors to aliens from outer space, and was watched by many hundreds of enthusiastic spectators who lined the route from the recreation ground to Foundry Square. Hayle's summer programme was also due to feature an Arts Festival and a Health and Wellbeing Festival, following the success of the two events last year, but both had to be put on hold. Hayle Town Council will announce new dates in due course.



# Rugby Club hopes new pitch will be ready by next autumn

The long-awaited scheme to provide new high-quality facilities at St Ives Rugby Club has reached a key milestone, with the appointment of contractors to build a new clubhouse and sports pitch. Cornwall Council has confirmed that Cornish contractors Fox Construction and W R Sandow will deliver the first phase of the project, and it is hoped that the pitch will be playable in autumn next year.

The scheme has been developed in partnership with the club and the RFU, and meets the requirements and standards of Sport England.

The existing training facilities are being moved north of their current site to provide a new sports pitch for use by the club and the local community, and the relocation of the clubhouse will free up the land needed to provide affordable homes and care housing.

Outline planning permission for up to 50 dwellings and up to 70 care units with associated open space was granted earlier this year.

Nearly £3 million has been received for the project from the government's Town Deal programme, along with £2m match funding from Cornwall Council.

Andrew Baragwanath, chair of St Ives Town Deal Board, said: "I am so pleased we have reached this stage of the plan to improve sporting provision in St Ives and free up land to provide new housing as well."

Ian Sanders from St Ives RFC said: "This development allows us to grow further on the pitch, whilst continuing to support the local community off it for another 100 years!

"We also welcome the opportunity to play our part in assisting with the need for housing in our town."

The Town Deal has a total budget of £19.9m for local schemes.

Just over two years ago, the former Edward Hain Hospital in St Ives hit national news. With £600,000 raised by its League of Friends, plus a £400,000 mortgage, the NHS's one million pound purchase price had been met. The Edward Hain Centre for Health and Wellbeing was born.

With the building in disrepair, and extensive health and safety standards to meet before services could begin, the mountain of work for the Centre's trustees and new manager, Sharron Goldingay, was enormous. Nevertheless, the Centre's first birthday celebration last September represented a milestone. With several rooms now refurbished, and members of the community enjoying a number of services within its newly-painted walls, the Edward Hain Centre was truly on its feet.

**Springing to Life** 

In late 2024, thanks to two grants, two staff members were brought on board. With extra hands on deck, in January this year, services took off. New courses rapidly filled up. The Centre's first independent providers moved in: Penwith Ear Care, and, in May, Samantha Evamy Counselling, joining St Ives Foodbank, which has been based at the EHC since mid-2024.

"We're now a regular hive of activity," says Sharron, who was recently promoted to director. "Along with ongoing groups like the NHS Pain Café and Knit & Natter, our health and wellbeing activities have been non-stop since January: yoga, Pilates (see photo), clinics, advisory sessions, and more, with lots in the pipeline, too."

**Community Open Day** 

In mid-August, the Centre received good news which will facilitate another major step forward. This news was not made public before St Ives Local went to press – but anyone who hasn't already heard can learn



about it at the Centre's second birthday Community Open Day on 6th September. The event, from 11am to 4pm, is open to all, with no charge for entry. Mayor Johnnie Wells will cut the ribbon at 11am, and refreshments are available all day for a small fee, with a barbecue from 1pm, grilled by St Ives Foodbank's founder, Chris Wallis.

This year, the focus of the event is on demonstrations of the Centre's services, including chair yoga, and a free group session of an exciting healing technique called EFT. In addition, there's music by Spaven Mor, an all-day craft event, a singalong for young visitors, and free ear checks from Penwith Ear Care

Volunteering

At the Open Day, there will also be a presentation by two EHC volunteers. "With new services, we need more helpers," explains EHC Chair, Lynne Isaacs. "So if anyone is interested in finding out more, we'd love to see you there." The benefits of volunteering to volunteers' own wellbeing are well known – and the EHC offers many ways to get involved. But as Lynne stresses: "Everyone is welcome at the Open Day, even just to mingle, chat, and have a cuppa and a piece of cake. The more the merrier!"

## Stavanger hosts Scout Jamboree

Last summer, I had the privilege of attending Roverway 2024, an International Scouting Jamboree held in Stavanger, Norway, alongside seven other Explorer Scouts and Leaders from across Cornwall. Over the course of two and a half weeks, we ventured through rolling hills, canoeing down interweaving rivers and lakes, and met hundreds of new friends from across the world ... all before joining the main camp in Stavanger.

The main event kicked off with the opening ceremony, comprising light shows, live Norwegian music, and speeches. This was attended by all 10,000 participants and organisers who were involved with the event. This was followed by International Day, when Scouts and Leaders from each country had the opportunity to showcase their culture, lifestyle and cuisine.

Other events throughout the week varied greatly, from workshop-style activities on leadership, sustainability, and climate change to water sports such as canoe races, kayaking and swimming. And the action didn't stop in the evenings! Every evening brought something new, whether that was live music and movie nights, or campfires, ceremonies and more international gatherings.

Following the main event on the Jamboree site, the UK contingent headed to Sola Beach to begin their post-event. We were invited to a hotel to spend the day on the beach to meet other UK Patrols, have a catered-for lunch together, and play a wide variety of games,



notably volleyball, before setting off on a 19hour ferry trip to Denmark, where we took a coach to Copenhagen for the remaining days of the event.

The next few days saw the UK contingent shaping their own experience for the post-event. All patrols were provided with a Copenhagen Card, allowing free access to a wide range of attractions across the city. Most notably, we visited the Illusion Museum, Botanical Garden and Tivoli Gardens, enjoyed a trip down the canal, and had a look round hundreds of local shops.

Finally, after two and a half weeks of exploring new counties, meeting new people, trying new foods, embracing new cultures, and making memories, it was time to head home. Roverway 2024 was one of the most extraordinary experiences of my life. I look forward to seeing how my journey continues. ### St Ives Farmers' Market

### A chat with Kate O'Shea of Chywoone Bee Happy Flowers

The bunches of flowers on your stall offer a colourful welcome to the market. Have you always had a passion for plants?

I've been growing since I was four – one of my teachers gave me some plants, because I showed interest in them. A few years ago, I bought two and three-quarter acres of land in Newlyn, and I've been planting it ever since. There's also an orchard and a large pond, and different areas are sheltered from winds from different directions. The garden takes a lot of looking after, but it's a beautiful place, and it gives me an excuse to buy plants – I like to go to Bodmin Plant and Herb Nursery, Trevena Cross, and Hardy Exotics.

How did you decide what to grow?

I'm growing a wide range of flowers, but I particularly like roses. I choose varieties which are scented, disease-resistant, weather-resistant and repeat-flowering. There are roses which don't grow well if I don't look after them: I use blood, fish and bone, and chicken meal, and give them a mulch of newspapers with cut foliage on top, which provides a home for all sorts of critters. My compost is very organic – my Bernese mountain dog, Cuthbert, is very good at firming it! I hope to make the land viable by doing flowers for weddings and funerals. The business is called Bee Happy Flowers, as the garden is very nature-oriented. During the time I've been there, the increase in the number of bees and other insects has been incredible. There are voles and hedgehogs, and I can hear owls. My plants are happily imperfect – the buds of roses can sometimes be damaged by wind and rain, but when they're open, they're gorgeous. The bunches have roses in bloom and in bud. I advise people to deadhead them to encourage more flowering. Some customers buy two bunches and put them together when the first flowers fade.



#### What brought you to St Ives Farmers' Market?


I was looking for a place where I could sell my flowers, and the people here are really friendly. On the day before the market, I finish picking the flowers at about 2pm, start arranging them by 3pm, and finish at about 10pm. It's hard work, but I enjoy it, and it's wonderful when people come up to the stall and smile. It's also creative, like drawing and painting, which I've been doing for a long time. I used to get up at 5am to paint the boats going past my house on the seafront at Newlyn.

What can people buy from your stall in September and October?

As well as roses, there will be hydrangeas, achilleas, sunflowers, rudbeckias and cannas, and also gingers and other exotics and grasses. I hope people will pre-order for their events from the stall. A lot of visitors like to buy something they can take home, and I'll be selling dried flowers off-season, and flower pictures and bunting.

# Art Teylu at Tate: A new family programme

This September, Tate St Ives welcomes the first Teylu Visiting Artist as part of its new year-round family programme, with a new artist invited annually to work onsite and make with local families.

Josie KO, an emerging contemporary artist whose work explores identity, Black British history and storytelling through large sculptural works and art materials that sit outside Western traditions, will be in the Foyle Studio every day from 24th to 28th September 2025. During her time at Tate, Josie will lead a series of workshops and drop-in sessions for local families, working with children and community groups to co-create a large scale immersive artwork. Her residency ends with a £1 Family Day on Sunday 28th September.

The new programme, called Teylu, a Cornish word meaning 'family', offers a fresh approach to how families engage with art and creativity at Tate St Ives. Designed to be ambitious in examining what art experiences for young people and children can be, while supporting visitors to explore, play, and make in ways that suit them. Whether that's with toddlers, teenagers, parents, carers, or chosen family, the programme is intergenerational and inclusive of all kinds of kin. Teylu runs throughout the year and includes several

strands shaped by the seasons, exhibitions, contemporary artists from across the UK and local voices.

School holidays bring STUDIO DO, a relaxed, drop-in creative space for families. The Foyle Studio is transformed into a creative play place where children and their grown-ups can build, draw, or simply take a moment together. Over October half term, artist duo Leap then Look will take over STUDIO DO with a new play-based sculptural installation. Led by artists Lucy Cran and Bill Leslie, visitors of all ages are invited to explore contemporary art through interaction, collaboration and making. This marks the beginning of a three-year project between Tate St Ives and Leap then Look: Palais Play, inspired by Barbara Hepworth and developed as part of the Palais de Danse museum.


In Spring 2026, Teylu Festival will fill the galleries with pop-up artist events and hands-on activities. These are designed to help children and adults explore exhibition themes through playful, accessible experiences. For 2026, the festival theme will be contemporary folk, with Cornish heritage and culture at its heart.

During the summer months, Beach Art Explorers takes creativity beyond the gallery and onto Porthmeor Beach. Aimed at 5 to 12 year olds, these artist-led sessions connect creative thinking with the landscape and natural environment of the Cornish coast.

For the youngest visitors, Toddle Tate runs monthly and focuses on colour, texture and movement. These sessions are designed for under 5s and their grown-ups to enjoy sideby-side, both in the gallery and out in the local area.

Accessibility is a key part of Teylu. Many events are low cost or free, with £1 entry days, free access for under 18s, and Local Pass holders. As a programme shaped with and for families, Teylu reflects Tate St Ives' ongoing commitment to inclusion, learning and community.

# **Recipe** | Ricotta doughnuts with butterscotch sauce

Resident St Ives Local chef Daniel Rouncefield is back with a new recipe. Why buy these beautiful, simple doughnuts when you can make them? "Serve with Cornish vanilla ice cream and fresh mint," Daniel suggests.

### Ricotta doughnuts INGREDIENTS

250g whole milk ricotta cheese
2 large eggs
65g caster sugar
1 tsp vanilla extract
Zest of 1 lemon or orange
125g all-purpose flour
1 1/2 tsp baking powder
1/4 tsp salt
Oil, for frying
Powdered sugar, for dusting

#### **METHOD**

In a bowl, whisk the ricotta, eggs, sugar, vanilla, and citrus zest until smooth. In another bowl, mix the flour, baking powder, and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the wet and stir until just combined.

Heat the oil to 175 degrees C. Drop heaped table spoons of batter into the oil and fry for 2 to 3 minutes per



side until golden. Drain on paper towels and dust with powdered sugar.

### Butterscoth sauce INGREDIENTS

100g brown sugar 60g unsalted butter 130ml double cream 1/2tsp vanilla extract Pinch of salt

#### **METHOD**

In a saucepan over medium heat, melt the butter and brown sugar, stirring constantly. When bubbling, add cream and salt. Simmer for 3 to 5 minutes until slightly thickened. Remove from the heat and stir in the vanilla. Let it cool slightly (it thickens as it cools). Enjoy!

### West Cornwall brew is Champion Beer of Britain

Local beer Mild (3.6% ABV), from Penzance Brewing Co, has been named Champion Beer of Britain by the Campaign for Real Ale (CAMRA). The announcement was made at the Great British Beer Festival, at the NEC in Birmingham, where head brewer Lewis Elliott and assistant brewer Richard Hickman picked up the award.

"It's quite overwhelming," said Lewis.
"I'm really glad the style [mild] has come
back. It's down to the founder of our brewery
Peter Elvin and his nephew, Rob, who showed
me the ropes."



# St Ives Archive: Memories of George Melly's visits to St Ives



George Melly (1926-2007) was an English jazz and blues singer, critic, writer, and lecturer who appeared several times in St Ives over the years with his regular band, John Chilton's Feetwarmers, notably at the Guildhall for the 1979 St Ives September Festival Ball. He was also asked to chair the debate "Has Modern Art Finished?" which was a lively event that crammed over 250 people into the Penwith Gallery.

George wrote about his September Festival visit in his column for Punch magazine, saying that he had asked where all the Cornish people were, as he only ever met visitors, and got the reply "Locals live up the hill, on the reservation". This caused local paper headlines of "Melly attacks St Ives", and when promoter Martin Val Baker attempted a return booking for Melly and his band the following year he was turned down by two halls in the town, so had to use St Ives Rugby Club for the gig on 22nd November 1980. Martin also put George and the band on at Demelza's in Penzance on 4th May 1984 – and they did manage to return to the Guildhall for another September Festival concert in 1985.

On 3rd November 1995 there was a two-hour BBC Radio 2 arts programme presented by George about his visit to St Ives that year, again for the September Festival. George was booked for a talk about British naïve art at the Penwith Gallery, with the event being so popular that a second sitting had to be hastily arranged. The radio show starts with George's arrival at St Ives railway station, from where he proceeds to take his listeners on a guided tour, between recordings of mainly festival-related performers.

On his travels around the town, George talks to festival organisers Martin Val Baker and Bob Devereux, harbourmaster Eric Ward, and St Ives Youth Band MD Eric Toll. He interviews several local artists, including David Kemp, Wilhelmina Barns-Graham and Janet Leach, and there is a more informal chat with Anthony Frost, Roy Ray,



Roy Walker and Barbara Karn, recorded in the Sloop Inn.


George was invited back in 1996 to play the September Festival at the Western Hotel with Chilton's Feetwarmers, and at the 1997 event he did two evenings of art talks: "Surrealism and Dada", and "The Pre-Raphaelites – Ultimate Romantics", both at the Regal Cinema. These were his last St Ives appearances, as far as I know. Martin Val Baker did book George to do talks at the Acorn Theatre in Penzance on 6th April 1999 and 6th May 2003, the last one being entitled "My Life and Times". His final public performance was at the 100 Club in London on 10th June 2007– less than a month before his death.

## Out on the Towans

#### A vintage summer

Looking back on this (mostly!) lovely sunny summer, we agreed that one of the highlights for Friends of the Towans was taking part in Hayle Carnival – a wonderful community event, which was well supported by both participants and spectators.

FOTT Arts Club leader Hilary Gibson lent us her Morris Minor Traveller for the occasion – and drove it in style – and we enjoyed decorating this vintage vehicle with bunting and Silver Studded Blue butterflies made by FOTT trustee Mary Tincombe.

We took a break from our practical conservation work during August, but we've still been busy. Hilary and her Art Club crew have enjoyed outdoor sessions around the Towans, and they held a Vintage Art Fair at Gwithian Village Hall, with cream teas and cakes, and the chance for visitors to buy art books and try their hands at seaweed painting. Save Our Sand beach cleaning sessions have been taking place throughout the summer at different beaches, and have proved very popular, attracting up to 20 volunteers. SOS coordinator Paul Clark and his team are grateful to Riviere Sands, Beachside and St Ives Bay holiday parks for their support – and refreshments! The next beach clean is on 9th September, back at Riviere Sands.

The Towans Recording Group held a nature walk at Godrevy Warren, led by former FOTT Ranger Martin





Rule (there's nothing Martin doesn't know about the Towans!). The group also ran plant surveys at Upton Towans during August, which will continue on Thursdays throughout September. And our practical conservation programme is about to restart, with sessions at Gwithian Green on 16th and 23rd September, continuing on most Tuesdays between 10am and 2pm at a variety of sites across the Towans. The sessions are free and open to all, but you'll need to book.

Throughout the summer, Friends of the Towans have been keeping an eye on a Cornwall Councilled scheme for St Gothian Sands. We don't believe that more car parking and food outlets are appropriate for a nature reserve, and we're concerned that interested parties such as the National Trust, Gwinear–Gwithian Parish Council, local landowners and business owners – and ourselves – were not consulted at the planning stage. Fortunately, the council has been willing to listen, and the plans are likely to be revised.

We know that many people like to walk their dogs on the Towans, but we're asking owners to keep them under control or on leads, to minimise distrubance to the Towans' resident creatures. As we said in our response to Cornwall Council: "FOTT should be the advocate of the Adder, the Skylark, the Silver Studded Blue and the Petalwort, not the domestic dog".



# Trevena Cross Nurseries diary: Get set for autumn planting

It's been a warmer than average summer – but the Great British weather will always give us some overcast and wet days along with beautiful sunny days. Explosions of floral colour here at Trevena Cross have brightened up the days which needed it and complemented the days that didn't!

Home-grown perennials wowed as usual, with colour-coordinated displays across the garden centre showcasing the huge variety available, and inspiring visitors to transport a piece of perennial heaven to their own gardens.

As autumn is often subject to gales, particularly in coastal locations like St Ives Bay, it is important to be aware of the condition of your windbreaks – whether fences or longer lasting hedges. Additionally, we'd advise keeping plants, especially the newly planted, shorter than you would normally, to protect them from 'wind rock', which destabilises a plant's roots and ultimately leads to its death.

# Property A touch of glass: how to plan your conservatory

It's a project many people put off for years, but creating a conservatory in your home can be a worthy investment. Not only can it potentially add value to your home, it also offers an alternative space to relax in, enabling you to feel closer to nature whilst still staying cosy.

Before anything else, it is crucial to identify the primary purpose of your new building project. Will the conservatory be used as a living space, dining area, home office, or playroom? Do you want it to serve as a greenhouse for plants? And how much space do you realistically have to play with? A conservatory can be an expensive project, so it's worth putting research time in at the very start to ensure your expectations are realistic and within your space, time, and money constraints.


There are several different conservatory styles to choose from, and it's important that your choice not only adheres to your aesthetic desires, but it also needs to fit into the look and feel of your home, garden and neighbourhood (because no one wants to be that neighbour!).

For instance, characterised by ornate details and rounded bay windows, the Victorian conservatory is a more traditional option. It is elegant, beautiful, and a fabulous environment for ladies who lunch. Alternatively, the Edwardian style provides more usable space. Its clean lines and elegant simplicity make it more versatile and modern for those who find the former option too old-fashioned.

If you have a small space, go for a leanto. This modern design, often referred to as a sunroom, is perfect for smaller spaces. Finally, if you really want to be fancy, consider an orangery — a luxurious alternative with brick pillars and a solid roof, making it more of a permanent room than a glass structure.

In the UK, conservatories don't need planning permission as long as certain conditions are met. They must be built at ground level, be single storey, and have less than 30 square metres in floor area. It needs to be separated from the house by external-quality walls, doors, or windows, and there should be an independent heating system with separate temperature and on/off controls.

Finally, the glazing and any fixed electrical installations must comply with the applicable building regulations requirements.


